

Course Requirements and Assignments

There will be 4 quizzes (15% each) and a comprehensive final exam (25%).

There will be two required trips: one to the Rosicrucian Egyptian Museum and the other to the Body World's exhibit at the Tech Museum of Innovation; each trip will require proof of visit and an exhibit review (5% each).

There will be two map (New World and Old World) assignments (2.5% each).

There will be extra credit opportunities based on preparedness for the review sessions; extra credit is worth one exam question.

Read the assignments before class and ask questions when something is unclear.

Guidelines for Museum Review Papers

- Visit the Rosicrucian Museum of Ancient Egypt and the Tech Museum of Innovation (Body Worlds Exhibit):
 - o Make sure to have either your ticket or a photo as proof of visit; the visit must occur in this semester.
 - o Write a review of your visit, which should be between 250 to 500 words in length.
 - What did you like (or dislike) about the museum?
 - What did you learn?
