Course Requirements and Assignments

This course will include 2 midterms and a final. There will be 10 quizzes; each quiz is worth 1% of your overall course grade.

This course will also include 2 writing assignments. The first writing assignment is roughly half the length of the second. I will describe and explain my expectations for these assignments during the semester. You will read the second paper 3 times: once for grammar, once for content, and once for form. I expect you to apply my feedback.

Grading Information

There will be one homework assignment per chapter; this will be completed using MindTap. I expect homework assignments to be turned in by the scheduled due date. Any assignments turned in late will lose 10% of possible points per day it is late; after the third day, you will receive a 0 for any homework not turned in. You may submit homework assignments more than one day late, but you must email me and request that I extend the due date. Assignments submitted within 24 hours of the due date will automatically lose 10% of possible points. This grading policy also applies to the writing assignments.

Exams and quizzes will consist of multiple choice, true/false, matching, and graphing questions. Exams will take place in class. Quizzes will cover material already discussed in class and/or material in the readings assigned for that day/week. The Final Exam will be partially comprehensive: approximately 40% will cover material from Midterm 1 and Midterm 2. You will need a Scantron 815 for each quiz and a Scantron 882 for each exam.

The first writing assignment will be assigned and explained before Midterm 1. Writing assignments will be submitted in class and on Canvas; students who fail to submit either the digital or physical copy will receive a grade higher than 50% of the available points for the assignment.

Your numerical grade will be based on the following categories and weights:
