


TheStudent reported feeling worse or much worse in a sevented sincluding time management (58.6%), Ability to socialize with fellow students (86.1%), Ability to socialize with friends (77.7%), and their overall psychological welleing (55.3%). This finding is troubling since it indicates the mental well-being of the students.




Figure 9. Student responses to Question: Overall, howchustress are you feeling about the

We followed this question with more directed question about student stress. 9% of students reported either a moderate or a great deal of stress related to the shelter in place (see Figure 9). 


Figure 15. Student responses to the Question: Since the move to online instruction in March 2020, have you spent more time studying the required material in your courses?
