Guidelines for Earning an M.S. Degree in Geology at San José State University

Four units of Geology 299, Master's Thesis, are required to complete the 30-unit graduate program. Typically, one unit is taken each semester, beginning with the first semester at SJSU, un I the requirement is sa sfied.

All graduate students are required to demonstrate their competency in wri en English as a requirement for gradua on. This requirement may be sa sfied in one of several ways; the simplest would be by comple ng Geology 213, 231, 234, or 238. The list of ways for sa sfying this requirement can be found here:

moreover, the student must provide a copy of the thesis to the rest of the commi ee one week before the presenta on. Scheduling of the presenta on shall be made with the approval of the student's thesis adviser.

In addi on to the program requirements listed above, the University requires all students to meet specific academic standards. A graduate student must maintain a cumula ve grade-point average of 3.0 (B) in all units a empted subsequent to admission. If a student's grade point average falls below 3.0, the student may be placed on or or disqualified from further enrollment. Once on probal on, a student must make progress toward returning to clear status by earning been er than a 3.0 grade-point average each semester. Graduate students are eligible to repeat courses with leer grades lower than "B" or with grades of "NC," "WU," or "IC" up to a total of 9 units, no male rehow many units there are in the individual degree program. Elec ve classes already taken in the degree program may be added to the candidacy f

So, what are the steps for comple ng the program? The typical candidate starts by enrolling in courses. It is important to become acquainted with as many students, faculty members, and ac vi es as possible. Students are the most important source of informa on on ma ers of survival in the system. Most of the specific procedures involved in obtaining a degree are worked out in coordina on with the thesis adviser so meet with them early and as o en as necessary.

As one might imagine, there are forms that need to be submi ed at various mes. These and other formal steps are summarized here in roughly the order in which they are encountered by a typical student.

No course included in the program may be older than 7 years at the me a student receives the Master's degree. New courses must be added to the program to replace those that become outdated. Under certain circumstances, expired courses may be "revalidated" by a wri en examina on or other test of subject competency as required by the faculty. No more than one-third (10 units) of the program may be revalidated.

- 7. Early in the student's final semester (check the Graduate Studies website for the exact date), the student must file an Applica on for Award of Master's Degree, available from the O ce of Graduate Studies. If the thesis is not completed that semester, the student must re-file the applica on and pay a fee.
- 9. \dot{u} The thesis should be prepared in close consulta on with the thesis supervisor and thesis commi ee. Specific informa on about format guidelines, deadlines, and other ma ers can be found on the websites of the College of Graduate Studies (GCS) and the Geology Department. Other specific ques ons should be directed to the thesis supervisor or graduate advisor.

The signatures of all members of the thesis commi ee must be secured before submi ng the thesis to CGS as a .pdf file, for approval. CGS will only review a thesis once each semester.

Full-text versions of the thesis are available through the MLK Library's online ins tu onal repository, depending on the publishing and license op ons the student selects. Students may order bound paper copies of their thesis through the ETD administrator.

A pdf of the thesis and a paper copy must be submi ed to the Geology Department when the final electronic version is sent to GUP.

When the course work has been completed and the thesis has been signed by the thesis

commi ee and accepted by the College of Graduate Studies, the University will award a Master's degree at the next commencement.
