## CORE COURSES

100W **History Writers' Workshop.** Development of skills required for practice of historical research & writing. Prerequisite: HIST 99.

- 173 **Constitutional & Legal History.** Origins and Evolution of the US Constitution and federal system from the American Revolution to the present. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 174 **New World Encounters.** Examines the first wave of European expansion, from 1492 to 1700. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 175 **Colonial & Revolutionary America.** Investigation of the colonial period and the American Revolution. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 176 **Inventing America.** Investigation of the early years of the United States, from the American Revolution to the Civil War. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 177 **Immigration & Assimilation.** Investigation of the immigration experience and the process of assimilation. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 178 **Civil Rights Movements.** Investigation of the civil rights movements in the United States. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 179 **US Military History.** Investigation of the military history of the United States. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 180 **Sex, Gender & Medicine.** Investigation of the history of sex, gender, and medicine in the United States. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 181 **The West.** Investigation of the history of the West in the United States. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 182 **LGBTQ+ History in the U.S.** Intersectional LGBTQ+ history in the US, emphasizing institutions, ideals, and identities. **SJSU Studies, Area S. 3 units.**
- 188 **History of Women in U.S.** Multi-faceted history of women in the U.S. from colonial times to present. **SJSU Studies, Area S. 3 units.**
- 189A **California History to 1900.** Topics include Native Americans, Spanish missions, the Mexican era, the American conquest, the Gold Rush, the railroad, Chinese immigration, and the anti-Chinese movement. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 189B **California History since 1900.** Topics include migration, growth, development, reform, immigration, depression, war, politics, protest, schools & environmentalism. **American Institutions, Area US3.**
- 197 **Introduction to Public History.** Introduction to preservation and presentation of history to the community and to roles of historians in public agencies, archives, museums, and historic sites. Required for admission to public history internship.
