### Written Assignments:

General formatting requirements for written assignments include a cover page, page numbering, 1" margins, strict double-spacing, and Times New Roman 12pt. Font. All assignments must be written in formal English, with college-level writing mechanics, and APA-style formatting, inclusive of in-text citations and references.

### Submission of Assignments to Canvas

Written assignments must be submitted to CANVAS. Written assignments uploaded to CANVAS must be in one of the following word processing file <u>formats:</u> MicroSoft Word(\*.doc or \*.docx). Tutorials are offered on the internet.

Students are required to submit all documents to Canvas. It is your responsibility to submit documents to Canvas that are in common <u>formats</u> so that the documents can be opened and processed by Canvas. Failure to submit documents in an acceptable format may result in a zero for that assignment. Students will be sent a message if the document cannot be opened or processed. If this continues to be a problem, students may receive a zero without further notice for assignments submitted in formats that cannot be opened and processed.

Embedded in Canvas is **Turnitin.com**, which generates an originality report. Each originality report is reviewed to evaluate for plagiarism. Documents that cannot be processed through turnitin.com cannot be graded. Documents that cannot be fully processed may result in a zero for that assignment.
