## **Course Description**

This course will examine juvenile delinquency and the juvenile justice system. Students will develop foundational knowledge of the juvenile justice process, including specialized juvenile law and the role of the courts, police, and corrections in juvenile justice.

The history, origins, and evolution of the juvenile justice system in the United States The historical shifts in policy and the treatment of juvenile delinquents, including current patterns and trends

The components of the juvenile justice system, their organizational and administrative structures, and the functions of each

The social context of delinquency

Intervention strategies and research on juvenile misconduct and delinquency


