SJSU Writing Requirement: To satisfy the University's Written Communication II requirement, students will be required to write a minimum of 8,000 words with an overall grade of "C" or better. Assignments in JS100W include: expository responses to justice related topics, a critique of scholarly literature, an annotated bibliography and the development of a research paper. All of these assignments provide practice in critical reading, thinking, and writing strategies necessary to plan and execute purposeful writing. Purposeful writing includes analyzing research, generating ideas, developing a thesis, organizing and writing a first draft, revising for form and content, editing for grammar, punctuation and spelling and evaluating, using, and documenting supporting materials.

- 1. Produce discipline-specific written work that demonstrates upper-division proficiency in: 1) language use, 2) grammar, and 3) clarity of expression. (CLO1)
