

KIN Major Advisor Assignments

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b. Most faculty, including your main KIN advisor, may not be available or responsive to email during the Summer and Winter breaks. Keep in mind is that faculty are busy at beginning and end of each semester, so be sure to plan-ahead and avoid waiting until the last minute to ask questions to your advisor. Poor planning on your part does not constitute an emergency on your advisor's part.

Suggestions When Communicating via Email

a. Use your SJSU email address for all communications. Your SJSU email address will also grant you access to the MLK Jr. Library, DocuSign, Zoom, and other useful resources that will aid in your academic career at SJSU. Check your SJSU email inbox consistently.

b. Offer your **SJSU ID#** when communicating with advisors for efficiency and ease-of-retrieval and address faculty, lecturers, advisors, and staff appropriately. Avoid overly-casual language.

c. When emailing your advisor or a professor, offer as much information as you can to guide the conversation and to establish context clearly. Ensure you are asking direct questions to receive direct answers.

b. Refer to the most recent **2024-2025 KIN UG Student Handbook** in conjunction with your MyProgress to track your degree requirements moving forward.

Understanding the KIN Undergraduate Student Handbook

When reading the KIN UG Student Handbook, pay close attention to:

- 1. GE requirements and the 120-unit SJSU graduation minimum requirement
- 2. KIN Core curriculum and classes
- 3. Specialization-specific KIN Sub-core curriculum and classes
- 4. Activity course requirements and activity course movement areas
- 5. Internship unit requirements
- 6. Pre-approved guided electives (contact your main KIN advisor to check if your specialization is pre-approved to pursue a minor outside the department).

Importance of Completing Listed Prerequisites

a. Throughout the handbook, there are active and clickable

The Department of Kinesiology offers two distinct degrees:

- 1. Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Kinesiology (with five specializations).
- 2. Bachelor of Science (B.S.) Kinesiology, Preparation for Teaching (PETE) with the option of pursuing Spartan Accelerated Graduate Education (SAGE) option.

The Three Major Components in Completing your Degree in Kinesiology:

- 1. Complete SJSU general education requirements.
- 2. Complete KIN major prerequisite courses and the KIN core curriculum.
- 3. Complete coursework for a selected KIN area of specialization (sub-core).

a. For students pursuing a B.S. in Kinesiology, select from one of the below specializations:

Exercise and Fitness Specialist

Rehabilitation Science

Inclusive Physical Activity in Communities (IPAC)

Sport Management and Culture

Individualized Studies (Advisor approval required)

Transfer Curriculum Studies (Certified AA/ADT degree and advisor approval required)

b. B.S. Kinesiology, Preparation for Teaching (PETE) is a separate major, not a specialization.

c. When selecting a KIN specialization, keep in mind your future goals. For instance, if you have plans on attending graduate school, be sure to do preliminary exploration of the school you are interested in and select a specialization that aligns with the desired prerequisites requested by the institution. The same goes for any post-graduation certification programs.

For transfer students with unique educational and career goals that do not align with one of the preexisting KIN specializations, the **Individualized Studies specialization** is an option.

Prior to selecting and pursuing the Individualized Studies specialization, you must receive approval from the KIN Advising Manager, Daniel Bohigian, and the KIN UG Coordinator, Dr. Erin Siebert, a minimum of 30 units prior to your anticipated graduation date.

A formal curriculum proposal with a complete written justification for each of the courses listed in the curriculum proposal will be required. Contact KIN Advising Manager daniel.bohigian@sjsu.edu for further information.

For transfer students with a previously-completed, **certified and posted ADT/AAT degree in Kinesiology**, the **Transfer Curriculum Studies** option may be applicable to pursue.

Prior to selecting and pursuing the **Transfer Curriculum** specialization, you must receive approval from the KIN Advising Manager, Daniel Bohigian, and the KIN UG Coordinator, Dr. Erin Siebert, **a minimum of 30 units** prior to your anticipated graduation date.

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Note Regarding Course Substitutions for the KIN Major

Substitutions will not be accepted for the following requirements:

- 1. KIN Core Curriculum
- 2. KIN Activity Courses
- 3. KIN Specialization Sub-core Curriculum
- 4. Internship Requirement

Substitutions may only be accepted for guided elective courses not listed on the pre-approved list within the KIN UG Student Handbook and as listed on your MyProgress. A documented agreement from a KIN major advisor will be required to process any course substation form.

MyProgress Basics

Your **MyProgress** will look different depending on the specialization you choose. You will notice differences for the following categories:

- 1. KIN Specialization Sub-core Curriculum
- 2. Internship unit requirements
- 3. Guided elective unit requirements

NOTE: the "Expected Grad Term" listed toward the top of your MyProgress page is **not official and** is **not a guarantee**. The semester and year is solely a prediction based on the number of units to be completed for your KIN degree.

Course History and Transfer Credits

a. The course history tab on your MySJSU page will offer an easy-to-read list and breakdown of your completed courses, including courses that have successfully articulated and transferred to SJSU from community colleges and junior colleges.

b. For transfer students, the **transfer credit** tab on your MySJSU page will offer a course-by-course list of the classes that appear on your transcripts from community college and junior college.

c. It is important to check the **articulation agreements** between your previous institution and SJSU to ensure transfer courses are being properly credited. a. When you have completed 85 or more units in totalto apply for graduation

b. Prior to applying for graduation, **even if you have been made eligible, you must meet with your advisor** to determine if you are going to be able to complete your remaining requirements in the time frame in which you apply for graduation.

c. Applying for graduation too early will result in the need to fill out a change of graduation date form which will negatively impact your priority registration status.

d. Keep in mind the Registrar's office makes all students with 85+ units completed eligible to apply, but the unit count does not necessarily take into consideration remaining KIN core, sub
