At its meeting of December 3, 2001, the Academic Senate passed the following Policy Recommendation presented by Ken Nuger for the Instruction and Student Affairs Committee.

POLICY RECOMMENDATION EXEMPTION FROM THE LATE DROP POLICY

Modifies S99-12

Whereas: A department, school or college may have valid reasons to approve or reject student

late drop requests for their courses and

Whereas: The current policy also may prevent a department, school or college from effectively

monitoring the sequence of courses students must complete to remain in compliance

with major requirements and/or credentialing and licensing requirements, and

Whereas: Currently there is no formal provision for a department, school or college to apply for

and receive an exemption from the late drop provisions of S99-12, thereby inhibiting

their ability to monitor in a timely fashion their students' course progression and

Whereas: Currently, exemptions to the current late drop provisions of S99-12 are granted on an

annual, undefined ad hoc basis, be it

Resolved: That the attached revision to S99-12 be adopted, with its implementation beginning

no later than August 1, 2002
