At its meeting of December 4, 2006, the Academic Senate passed the following Policy Recommendation presented by Sigurd Meldal for the Instruction and Student Affairs Committee.

### **POLICY RECOMMENDATION**

#### **AMENDMENT OF POLICIES S73-4 AND S97-1 Second Baccalaureate Registration Priority**

Affected policies: S73-4, S97-1

Whereas: The current registration policy (S97-1) does not mention second baccalaureate students, and

Whereas: The policy providing guidelines for second baccalaureates (S73-4) does not refer to registration packets for continuing second baccalaureate students, therefore be it

Resolved: That section (2) of S73-4 be removed:

2. All new second baccalaureate students shall receive registration packets with Juniors.

And the subsequent sections be renumbered accordingly.  
And be it further

Resolved: That the registration policy S97-1 be amended to list second baccalaureate students between seniors and juniors in priority, the priority list to become:

- Group 1: Priority Students
- Group 2: First Time Freshmen
- Group 3: Graduating Students (Seniors, Graduate Students, Second Baccalaureate Students)
- Group 4: Graduate Students
- Group 5: Seniors
- Group 6: Second baccalaureate students
- Group 7: Juniors
- Group 8: All other students

(Students in Groups 2-8 will register on the basis of rotating alphabetical cycles within each group).

And be it further

Resolved: That the Registration Policy (S97-1) as amended by this policy be implemented for the Summer 2007 semester if possible, but no later than Fall 2007.
