#### ALCOHOL AND DRUG ABUSE PREVENTION COMMITTEE

Whereas, The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Committee established by S 89-9 as

amended by S 92-11 has accomplished its charge, to wit, that it "shall coordinate and plan a comprehensive substance abuse program..."; and

Whereas, Having accomplished its charge, the committee is by its own admission much too large; and

Whereas, The committee has recommended that it be restructured; therefore be it

# Resolved:

That S 89-9 and S 92-11 are rescinded and replaced by the following:

- 1. The Alcohol and Drug Abuse Prevention Committee shall continue as a Special Agency.
- 2. The committee shall serve as an advisory group to the University President, to the University community, and to the Prevention Education Program (PEP)
- 3. Members of the committee shall be appointed by the President for staggered three year terms, as follows:

- a. The Director of PEP, the Director of Health Services (or designee), a representative from residential life, a representative from the Division of Intercollegiate Athletics, a staff person, a representative from Counseling, a member of the Faculty (nominated by the Committee on Committees), a student representative from PEP Student Educators and a student nominated by the Associated Students.
- b. The chair shall be designated by the President.
- 4. The committee shall report to the President. The President shall consult with the Academic Senate on all recommendations affecting policy.
