I am seeking your support to serve as your Statewide representative on our Senate Executive Committee. I was elected to the Statewide Senate first in 2017 to take over Trustee Sabalius' seat, and again in 2018 when his/my term expired. In my first year, I attended meetings of the Statewide Fiscal and Governmental Affairs committee (FG&A) and the Academic Affairs Committee (AA). This year, I am serving on AA and the Committee on Academic Technology and Online Education (CATOE). In addition to our regular committee work in AA, I have written two Statewide resolutions, one that seeks to generate better data from the Chancellor's Office on student success outcomes and one that asks the Chancellor's Officeish estab working group to look into the implications of advances in Artificial Intelligence on the CSU.
