In 2008, President Don W. Kassing reaffirmed the University's commitment to equitable practices by suspending campus blood drives, recognizing that the "Food and Drug Administration's regulations prohibit gay men from donating blood because of their sexual orientation,²" are discriminatory, and

blood donation, replacing discriminatory bans with non-gendered,

individual risk assessment questionnaires that apply equally to all3, and

Whereas, The Academic Senate of San José State University recognizes that this

data-driven, equitable approach to blood donation now aligns with our non-discrimination principles, and provides equal opportunity for the LGBTQI+ community to participate in blood donation. Therefore, be it

Resolved, That in response to the Food and Drug Administration's revised policies

regarding blood donation, the Academic Senate of San José State

University supports resumption of blood drives on our campus.
