## EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MINUTES December 5, 2005

1. The Executive Committee discussed possible nominees to attend the Retention-Tenure-Promotion (RTP) Conference.

- 2. The Executive Committee discussed and approved nominees to various University Planning Council (UPC) Panels.
- 3. The Executive Committee discussed and approved college nominees to the Institutional Review Board (IRB) Task Force including: Michael Gorman, Sally Veregge, Gloria Weddington, and Jan English-Leuck.
- 4. The Executive Committee discussed and approved the Election Calendar for Spring.
- The Executive Committee discussed S93-7, Adding Students to Classes After Touchtone Registration and on the First Day of Classes. The Executive Committee discussed contacting Dea Nelson in Enrollment Services regarding this issue.
- 6. Report from the Senate Chair:
  - a. The Executive Committee discussed a possible referral to Professional Standards to revise the RTP document to reward faculty that involve students in research projects. Possible rewards include funding those proposals that involve students first, and/or assigned time for the faculty member.
  - b. The Executive Committee discussed an incident involving the video and audio taping of lectures. The Executive Committee decided to consult with legal counsel first about this issue.
- 7. Policy Committee Reports:
  - a. Curriculum and Research Committee (C&R): Senator David said that the committee is working on a policy the Institutional Animal Use Committee.
  - b. Professional Standards Committee (PS):

Senator Bros said the committee is continuing to work on the RTP policy which they have radically modified, and the committee has come up with a solution to the financial impact problem.

## c. Organization and Government Committee (O&G):

Senator Parsons said the committee is working on a resolution removing the Vice Chair from some committees, and also on a policy with bylaw changes due to the college of social work's recent move. The O&G committee will also be working on changes to F98-2, the Selection and Review of Administrators policy.

## d. Instruction and Student Affairs Committee (I&SA):

Senator Thames said that the committee is bringing two policies to the Senate today, the Grade Distribution Report policy and the Final Exam policy. The committee is also working on a Hazing policy, Affordable Textbook policy, and Student Organization Code of Conduct.

## e. CSU Statewide Senator Report:

Senator Van Selst said that the CSU Statewide Senate is still working on the issues of the joint doctorate, General Education, and the Lower Division Numbering System.
